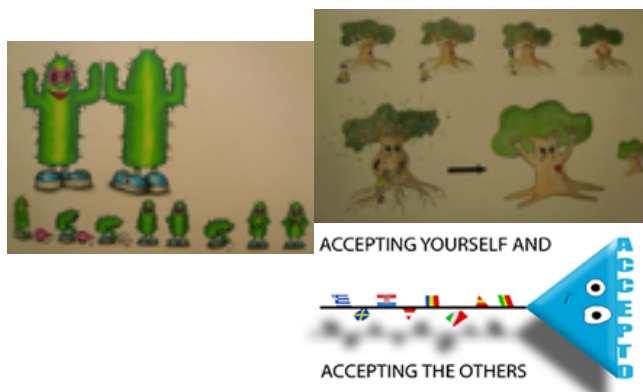
About “Accepto”

Accepto is an European multinational project which main purpose is to connect young students from the different countries to fight against bullying. The venture takes in student and teachers from nine different countries: Romania, Italy, Greece, Croatia, Portugal, Latvia, Spain, Poland and Sweden.

The first meeting: Roman, Romania

The first meeting took place in Roman, Romania and the main objective of this first encounter was, among meeting each other, to choose the mascot of the project.

Each country brought a mascot designed by the students of each school. Each student created a different mascot, with its name and its story and later the rest of the students voted which one liked the most.



The mascot which was finally chosen was the one proposed by Italy. It represents a blue kite, where “accepto” can be read. Hanging the rope of the kite we can see the colors of the flags of the



countries which are present in the project, from left to right: Greece, Poland, Croatia, Latvia, Romania, Italy, Spain and Portugal.

This one was chosen because it represents the union of all the European countries trying to finish with the bullying.

The stay in Roman

Since our arrival in Romania we have enjoyed a festive and joyful atmosphere. We were welcomed by very nice and friendly colleagues. Not only were our colleagues both kind and careful, but so too were all the people involved in the organization of our stay.

The first day, Tuesday 28th of October 2014, we visited the school where a group of boys and girls danced traditional dances dressed with their classic suit.



After the reception we went to a kindergarten and a high school in

order to know more about the different levels on education in the country. We also had a reception with the mayor of Roman and we started the discussions about the project. The rest of the days we did a little bit of tourism to be introduced in the culture of the country and its traditions. We also spent a lot of time in the classrooms with the students in order to know more about their subjects the methodology of the class, the atmosphere in the class and the relations between the students.
